Locating information on a property/land






Zoom in on the map and identify the place you need information on. Note down the INSPIRE ID reference number – as shown ringed in red here



What is an INSPIRE ID.?

"The Land Registry uses unique 8-digit identifier numbers associated with each registered title to locate and access information about a particular property" – like this one



Go to the HM Land Registry


Be careful to check it is a .gov.uk website as often a number of 'imposters' come top of a search list



Choose to search for 'land and property information'


Scroll to find the INSPIRE option


Put the INSPIRE number in the box and Search



It will display some basic information of the property, if this appears to be the one you want, you can choose which reports to purchase

- Choose what you want to purchase
- Pay on card
- Download the PDF documents




Locating information on a property/land

https://bit.ly/4dV2lqA enter this in the URL and you will get the map below



Zoom in on the map where you need to look – find the number inside the line of the building you need to find ownership of eg. The one I have ringed



- Go to https://www.gov.uk/government/organisations/land-registry
- Then choose "search for property ownership"
- o Then START
- o Find the input box for the INSPIRE number and put in the number from the map
- o It will display some basic information of the property, if this appears to be the one you want, you can choose which reports to purchase, eg:
- Choose what you want to purchase
- o Pay on card
- Download the PDF documents
- Do not forget to 'save' them

You can search any property/land 'if' it has been registered with the Land Registry. If the land appears as above example 'no outer line' then it will be an old property which hasn't changed hands for some years and hasn't been registered the example above is a Church.
